1 Summary

Continuous archaeological recording was undertaken during the excavation of a posthole for to the installation of an interpretation panel at Lexden Mount. No archaeological evidence was encountered.

2 Introduction (Fig 1)

This report presents the results of continuous archaeological recording at Lexden Mount, near 11 Wordsworth Road, Colchester, Essex, CO3 4HR, carried out in September 2016. The work was commissioned by Philip Wise on behalf of Colchester Borough Council in advance of the installation of an interpretation panel at Lexden Mount, and was undertaken by Colchester Archaeological Trust (CAT).

In response to consultation with Colchester Borough Council Planning Services (CBCPS), Colchester Borough Council Archaeological Advisor Dr Jess Tipper advised that in order to establish the archaeological implications of this application, the applicant should be required to commission a scheme of archaeological investigation in accordance with paragraphs 128, 129 and 132 of the *National Planning Policy Framework* (DCLG 2012).

All archaeological work was carried out in accordance with a *Brief for Continuous Archaeological Recording*, detailing the required archaeological work, written by Dr Jess Tipper (CBCPS 2016), and a written scheme of investigation (WSI) prepared by CAT in response to the brief and agreed with CBCPS (CAT 2016)

In addition to the brief and WSI, all fieldwork and reporting was done in accordance with English Heritage's *Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (MoRPHE)* (English Heritage 2006), and with *Standards for field archaeology in the East of England* (EAA 14 and 24). This report mirrors standards and practices contained in the Institute for Archaeologists' *Standard and guidance for archaeological field evaluation* (ClfA 2014a) and *Standard and guidance for the collection, documentation, conservation and research of archaeological materials* (ClfA 2014b).

3 Archaeological background

The following archaeological background draws on the major published sources for Colchester archaeology (listed below), and also on the Colchester Historic Environment Record (CHER) (previously Urban Archaeological Database (UAD)) and the Essex Historic Environment Record (EHER).

Lexden Mount (scheduled monument 1019963) is a Roman barrow that was crudely excavated in 1910. The mount appeared to have been largely disturbed. No burial was found in the centre of the mound and the only finds from the excavation as a whole consisted of Roman tiles and oyster shell (CAR 11). Despite this, Lexden Mount remains substantially intact. Further burials may remain undisturbed both beneath the barrow and within the sides of the mound. The mound itself will contain valuable evidence for the date and manner of its construction, and the old ground surface, sealed at the time of the barrow's construction, may retain evidence of funerary rituals or earlier activity within this part of the *oppidum*. The Mount is one of the more prominent funerary monuments of Camulodunum and, together with the other high status burial sites in the area (like Lexden Tumulus), provides significant insights into elite burial practices.

4 Results

The site was continually monitored while the posthole required for the installation of the interpretation panel was excavated. The posthole was 500mm by 400mm and was excavated to a depth of 600mm. It was dug into a made ground layer comprising brick and tarmac. No archaeological remains were present.

5 Discussion

No archaeological finds or features were observed during the monitoring of the excavation of a posthole at the site. The posthole for the interpretation panel was dug through a layer of made ground comprising brick and tarmac.


